Our Early Head Start Centers celebrated Dr. Seuss's birthday in March with Dr. Seuss Week.

In the 2018 program year, the Sunrise Children's Foundation (SCF) Early Head Start (EHS) Child Care Partnership (SCF EHS-CCP) program was funded \$3,633,556 through the US Dept. of Health and Human Services to provide EHS services to 200 children aged birth to three (3) years. The program received in-kind volunteerism, community services and meeting space valued at \$442,348.

EXPENSE OVERVIEW

Budgetary expenditures of \$3,633,556 included program personnel/fringe benefits; parent services, insurances, administrative expenses, training and technical assistance; equipment and classroom supplies; print/copy; contractual and nutrition services. The proposed funding request for 2019 is: \$3,725,786 to expend in the same categories.

ENROLLMENT

Throughout the year eligible children and 255 families were enrolled in the 200 funded slots. Of all children enrolled, 100% were eligible for services. Monthly average enrollment was also 100%.

PROGRAM MONITORING
